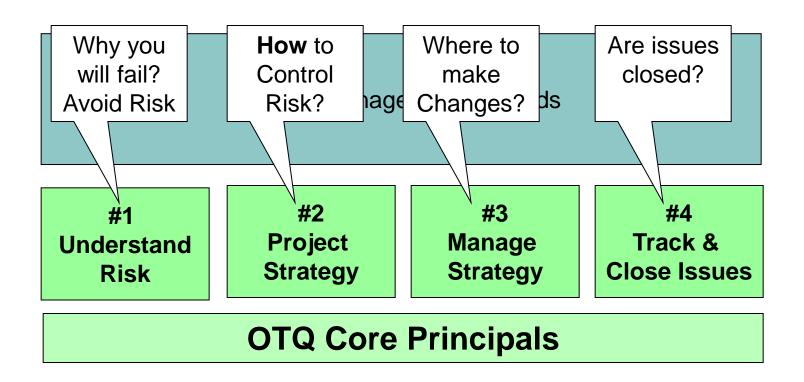

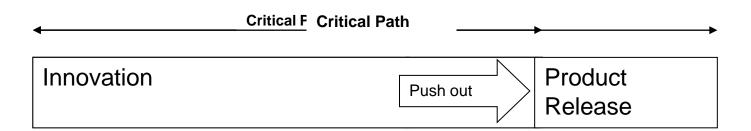


#2. Project Strategy Incremental Development



Traditional Approach

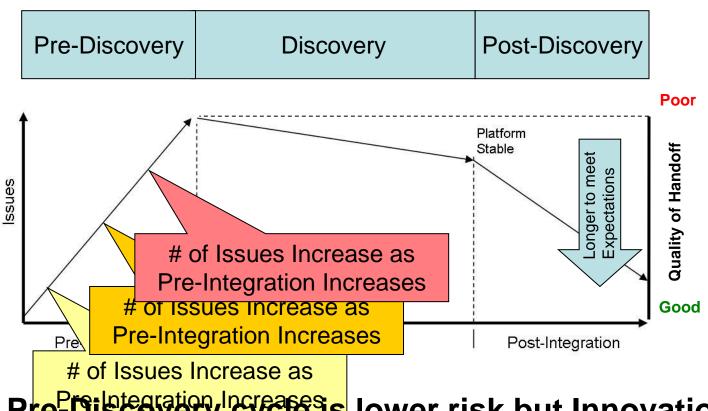
 The critical path of a project is the longest path through the project with the least amount of flexibility.





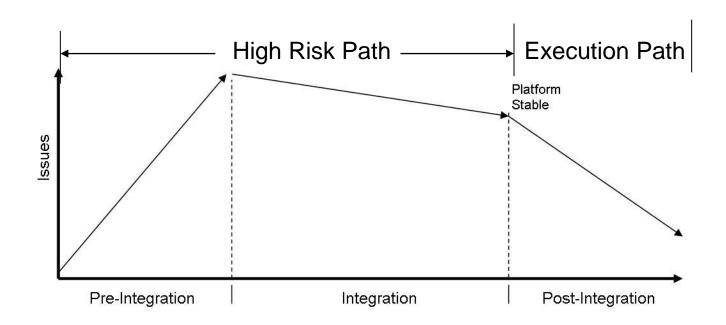
Tip 1 – Shorten Pre-Discovery

Critical Path for Innovation



Short Pre-Discovery Cycles lower risk but Innovation often requires a longer Pre-Discovery cycles

Tip #2 - Decouple Innovation



High Risk Path (HRP)

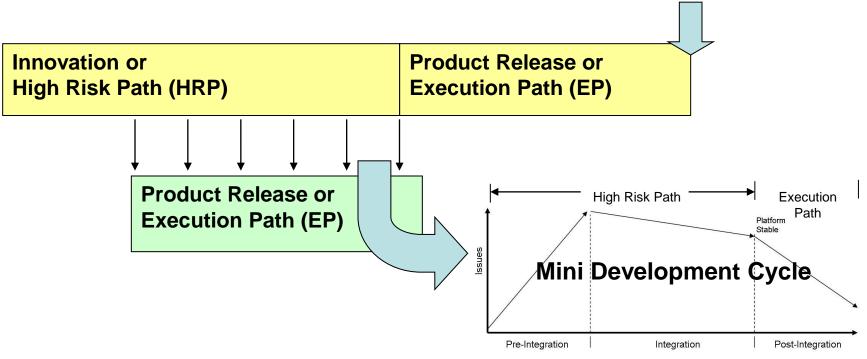
The path where the tasks, dependencies and the resources contain an unacceptable high amount of risk (i.e., **Innovation**)

Execution Path (EP)

The path for product release activities (i.e. Post Integration or Green activities)



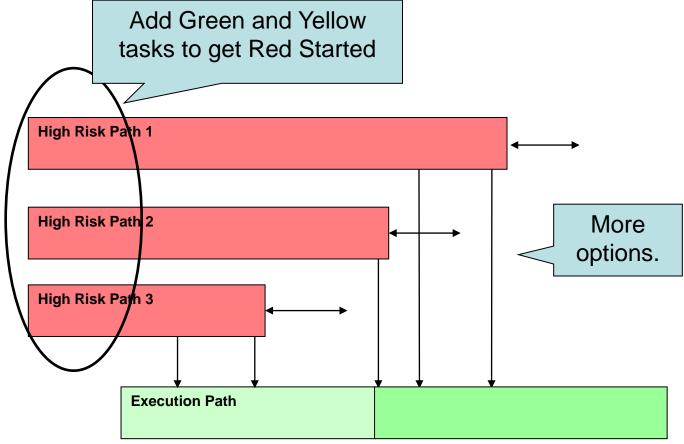
Planning Innovation



- Several well-planned handoffs from the HRP to the EP
 - Keeps Integration milestones short
 - Quicker Learning and Feedback
 - Always pull Innovation to the Execution Path

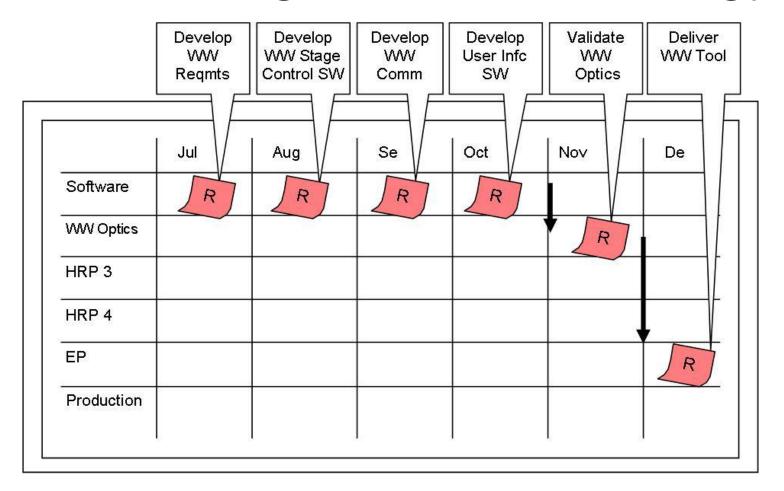


Multiple High Risk Paths



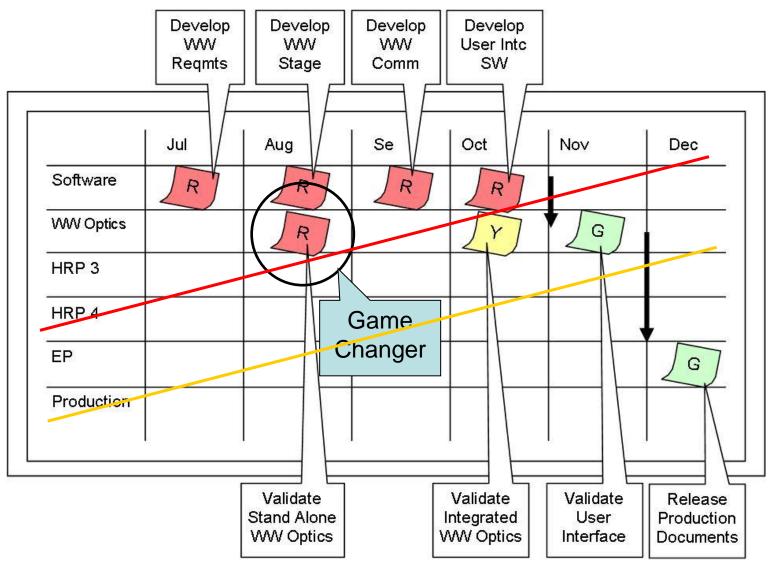

Reducing Execution Risk

- Move high risk, activities as early in the project as possible.
- Keep High Risk Activities independent of each other as much as possible.
- Define incremental handoffs and deliverables to shorten the learning cycle.
- Don't deliver more that the receiving person or group can handle.



Reducing Handoff Risk

After placing Post It notes, draw in the handoffs

- Avoid a series of handoffs between HRPs where one HRP hands off to a second HRP which hands off to a third, etc.
- Avoid back and forth hands-offs between HRPs. Handoffs should go in one direction.
- Avoid making one big handoff from one HRP to another or from an HRP to the EP.
- Handoffs to the Execution Path should begin after two intervals.



Reducing Resource Risk

Assign resources by writing names on the Post It notes

- Are they able to perform activity successfully?
- Don't share key resources between high risk activities.
- Avoid having resources jump back and forth between project paths.
- Identify indirect support such as training, technical advice, etc.
- Always ask, "can someone else perform the activity?"



Finalize the Project Strategy

- Choose a Format
 - Team members can access and quickly interpret
 - You can see the problems and take action
 - Requires no extra work for reporting to Management
- Consider using Excel



Project Meetings

- Conduct smaller, more focused meetings for each of the HRPs and EP since they have different goals and resources
- Consider making attendance optional for team members whose tasks are on schedule
